JUNE 10-12, 2010

Madison, Indiana

Call for Proposals: Bloom's Taxonomy is composed of six levels of thinking. Students often have difficulty extending their cognitive processes beyond the lower levels of knowledge and understanding. The theme for the 2010 Teaching Family Science Conference is *"Developing Higher Order Thinking in Family Studies Students."* This may include activities, assignments, projects or other pedagogical tools used inside and outside the classroom. Indication of how the practice is evaluated will be considered. Conference sessions are generally interactive in nature. Proposals will be blind, peer-reviewed and will be evaluated on the basis of clarity, relevance and evidence of participant involvement. Registration for the conference can be completed through postal mail or through PayPal on the web. Registration is \$135 and includes three breakfasts, two lunches, a riverboat dinner cruise, breakout snacks, a trolley ride through historic Madison, and entrance to two historic homes in Madison. *The final date for registration is June 2, 2010.*

Accommodations: The conference will be held at the Riverboat Inn, 906 E. 1st Street in Madison, Indiana. The Inn is situated on a hill with a broad open expanse view of the Ohio River. Room rates are \$60 for a single and \$90 for others. *For reservations call 812-265-2361.*

Local Attractions: Madison has the largest national historical landmark district in the United States. Charles Kuralt called it the most beautiful river town in America. Numerous historic buildings are available to tour. Riverfront Park extends the width of the city with brick walkways, benches, and lights. It is not uncommon for the Mississippi Queen, the Delta Queen and the Mississippi Queen to be docked along the river. Clifty Falls State Park with hiking trails, lodges, and camp sites is one mile from downtown Madison.

Travel: Madison is easy to reach by air. Louisville and Cincinnati airports are within 44 miles; and Indianapolis is 103 miles. Interstates 64 and 71 are within easy driving distance from Madison.
